Children and adults connect with nature through our hands-on environmental education programs at schools and for groups including Head Start, Boys & Girls Clubs, Girls Inc., and scouting troops. Fast Facts

- ✦ At least 20 at-risk species have been protected on our properties, including the Indiana bat, barn owl, bobcat, and bald eagle.
- ✦ The trees we plant and protect contribute to cleaner air, offsetting carbon emissions, and preventing harmful erosion.
- ✦ Wetlands clean water for habitats, drinking water, and agriculture.
- ✦ Our public nature preserves provide access to nature, which improves physical and mental health, and quality of life.
